## Brief BGA History



Many years ago, Vestavia Country Club conducted a July 4th annual Invitational Tournament. During the weekend, the club hosted a past Champions Dinner. It was a highlight of the tournament for all former champions and was always a memorable occasion.

At the Champions Dinner in 1962, a discussion evolved that there should be a Birmingham Golf Association with the following objectives: to provide clubs group purchasing for sand, seed, fertilizers, etc. to obtain lower costs per club; to serve as a clearing house for clubs to avoid conflicts of dates in scheduling events; to conduct an annual championship and junior championship; to stage exhibitions for the enjoyment of members in member clubs; and to raise funds for worthy causes, especially junior golf.

In attendance at that 1962 dinner (and the year they won are as follows): Press Thornton 1953, 1954, Buddy DeBardeleben 1955, Walter Wood 1956, Elbert Jemison 1957, John Gross 1958, 1962, Jack Vardaman 1959, and Jim Head 1961. Also in attendance were L. J. Griffis, club general manager, Russ Dimick, club tournament chairman, and Jack Murphy, head golf professional.

It was agreed that there should indeed be a Birmingham Golf Association. Elbert Jemison was asked to serve as the first President, and to formulate a Board of Directors consisting of two members from each of the private clubs in the area. It also was suggested that Joe King and Bob Ramsay represent the Country Club of Birmingham; Jerry Seigel, Pine Tree Country Club; Jim Norton and Russ Dimick, Vestavia Country Club; and Johnny Thames, Mountain Brook Club.

The following year the Board of Directors decided to create a Birmingham Golf Association Hall of Fame. The first induction class was in 1965 and the list of inductees is found on the back page of this program. The names of the inductees are also featured on a plaque at the Alabama Sports Hall of Fame.

The BGA is an IRS recognized 501 (c)(3) charitable nonprofit organization.





#### Jamelle Shaw

Jamelle Shaw was just trying to raise a little money for her women's golf team at Samford University. Close to 25 years later she's still raising money; it's just the scope is a lot larger.

She started the Lady Legacy Scholarship Foundation that goes hand-in-hand with the Lady Legacy Metro Championship and the funds raised each year have helped, and continue to help, many, many young women attend college, as well as helping establish or enhance middle school and high school women's golf teams. Shaw moved on from Samford many years ago, but her heart for

women's golf remains.

"Back then we didn't have any money for (golf) bags, uniforms, etc. (at Samford). The (BGA's) Men's Legacy was very popular and there was no ladies version. I thought it would be a great tournament and a great way to raise money," Shaw said.

"So, the Lady Legacy Metro Championship was born and we played it at Bent Brook early on.

"The Ladies Birmingham Golf Association became involved and money started to be raised through Lady Legacy reps at their local clubs. This is how we continue to raise money."

Shaw was joined as a founding director by Kathy Baggio, Jean Miller and Mary Welden. They realized they could do a vast amount of good by establishing a scholarship fund to help girls attend college.

Their first scholarship was \$500; it's now \$16,000, spread over four years, with over \$200,000 awarded.

And they help grassroots golf by awarding grants to area middle school and high school girls golf programs. Sixteen schools received up to \$750 each last year and over \$70,000 has been awarded.

"To have the BGA recognize me in this special way is beyond anything I could ever imagine," Shaw said.

"While I have the distinct honor of being recognized, please know that there are many other women and men who have worked tirelessly and served on our board that deserve the majority of the credit for the success of the Lady Legacy Scholarship Foundation. The LBGA (Ladies Birmingham Golf Association) was so kind to partner up with us by providing Lady Legacy representatives from their clubs who annually raise the money for the grants and scholarships."

She is a member at Shoal Creek.





#### Mike Greer

Greer, who grew up in Vernon moving to the Birmingham area in 1986, has long been a top amateur player and continues to be such. He played college golf the University of North Alabama, as did his son, Jake.


He has captured nine Alabama Golf Association championships: State Four Ball championships with John Stewart and Robbie Cotten; three State Mid-Amateurs; and four State Senior Four Ball titles with BGA Hall of Fame member Tom Jungkind.

"To be honest, it was kind of a surprise (his impending induction),"

Greer said.

"I've had a decent career playing (amateur) golf and I'm most honored and humbled. The game has been great to me and I still love it."

He was a long-time member of Inverness Country Club.



#### T.P. Mills

T.P. Mills grew up in and lived in Tuscaloosa, designing putters that would become famous in golfing circles the world over.

He believed in the early 1960s that he could design and produce a putter that would be superior to the one he used. That was the start of the T.P. Mills Co.

Truett P. Mills Sr., who passed away in 2006 aged 85, started with little more that basic hand tools and unformed blocks of carbon steel. He began designing, shaping and building true handmade putters that would lead a whole industry. Going on for over 40 years, the

company continues to build carbon-steel putters of high renown.

What started out as a hobby, became his job...one he loved and it is continued on by his son, David.

His handmade putters, thanks to word of mouth, soon found themselves into the hands of some of golf's greatest players.

Arnold Palmer, Lee Trevino and Phil Mickelson are just a few of the players who have won major championships using a T.P. Mills putter.

"This (BGA Hall of Fame) recognition is a wonderful honor for our family," David Mills said. "I know my Dad would wholeheartedly be so very proud. For him to be so honored by such a distinguished organization is very special indeed."

Mills built putters for a Who's Who of top amateurs from across the state including, but far from limited to, former State Amateur champions Sonny Holt, Sam Farlow, Jackie Cummings, M.C. Fitts, Mac McLendon, Hubert Green, Buddy Gardner, Cecil Ingram III, Steve Lowery and Hunter Hamrick amongst many others.

He was a long-time member of the Country Club of Tuscaloosa.


